

LETTER FROM OUR SENIOR PASTOR

Dear friends,

I consider myself a connoisseur of barbeque and I enjoy visiting our state's and region's legendary barbeque establishments. A few weeks ago, I had a meeting in Orangeburg, which of course meant a trip to the legendary Duke's Bar-B-Que. Even though I have been serious about eating healthy these last few months, I threw caution to the wind and ate hash and pork until I could eat no more.

As I was eating, I began to reflect on what makes a truly good barbeque restaurant. Without question, the measure of a good barbeque restaurant is the degree to which it focuses on barbeque. If it focuses too much on fancy decor, an attractive location, or non-pork foods, the quality of the barbeque will decrease accordingly. It's okay if they serve things like macaroni and cheese, coleslaw, and banana pudding, which complement barbeque rather than detract from it, but it is important for barbeque to remain the focus. *Keeping the main thing the main thing* leads to greatness and, in the case of barbeque, deliciousness. Think about it. We would not expect McDonald's to have good spaghetti any more than we would expect an Italian restaurant to have good Pad Thai.

By the time you read these words, the General Conference of the United Methodist Church may have already concluded. Regardless of the outcome of General Conference, Central will be fine as long as we remember the barbeque principle. We must continue to keep the main thing the main thing, which is to say we must focus on the mission and ministry God has given us. God has placed Central in a community where people still need to hear the call to follow Jesus and in which there are profound spiritual, physical, and social needs. Our mission is to follow Jesus by loving God and loving our neighbors. *That* is our main thing, so let's focus on it, and join God in God's work among us.

Central will send nine lay delegates and three clergy, but everyone is invited to come and participate! 


